Dear Year 11 Students, Parents and Carers,

I am writing to you to confirm the arrangements for Term 4 for Year 11 students. As announced by our ACT Chief Minister yesterday, the intent is for Year 11 students to continue with remote learning at the beginning of term and then return to on-campus learning from Week 3 (Monday 18 October), as long as health conditions hold. This will allow Year 11 to complete course work and assessments that contribute to their senior secondary certificate.

Given that Year 12 students will return to on-campus learning at the start of Term 4, complications arise for composite classes that contain both Year 11 and Year 12 students. Catholic Education is currently clarifying the impact of this decision on Year 11 students and they may have further advice in the coming days.

In the meantime, the following arrangements will be in place for JPC Year 11 students for the first two weeks of Term 4:

- The current (non ILT) timetable will continue to operate.
- Year 11 classes that only include Year 11 students will continue as they are currently operating: Teachers will run 2 virtual meeting classes at the beginning and end of each week at the timetabled time for that subject.
- Year 11 classes that include Year 12 students will be live streamed through Teams by their teacher who will teach Year 12 students face to face at school. This will enable Year 11 students to participate in the lesson.
- During the middle lesson of the week, students will continue to complete the assigned 1.5h work for their subject, in combination with the effective use of their non-scheduled lesson time.
- The roll will continue to be marked in the usual way for the 2 'formal' lessons of the week.
- When Year 12 Tertiary students are engaged in the ACT Scaling test on Tuesday 12th and Wednesday 13th October, there will be no live-streaming of classes. Year 11 classes will revert to the current virtual meetings.

I will write to you prior to the end of Week 2 Term 4, with the arrangements that will be in place at school for Year 11 students when they return to on-campus learning on 18 October. As announced by the ACT government, remote learning will continue for Catholic Education students in Kindergarten to Year 10 during the first four weeks of Term 4.

Vaccination appointments are now available for young people 16 years and over. If your student has not yet booked their vaccination we encourage them to do so. Getting our young people vaccinated



protects them, their families and the whole community. It will also help the ACT reach its vaccination targets faster. You can find more information about the vaccination program and how to book on the [ACT Government's COVID-19 website](#).
